Commodity Trends:

Jobs Report: The Bureau of Labor Statistics announced that total Nonfarm payrolls increased by a seasonally adjusted 287,000 in June, the strongest month of hiring since October of 2015. Nearly every sector of the economy added workers to power a dramatic swing from May’s dismal payroll gain of 11,000, which was the weakest reading since 2010. The unemployment rate rose to 4.9% in June from 4.7% in May.

Retail Sales: The Commerce Department said that sales at retailers and restaurants rose 0.6% in June following a 0.2% gain in May. The results beat analyst expectations, with estimates ranging from 0.5% decrease to a 0.3 percent increase.

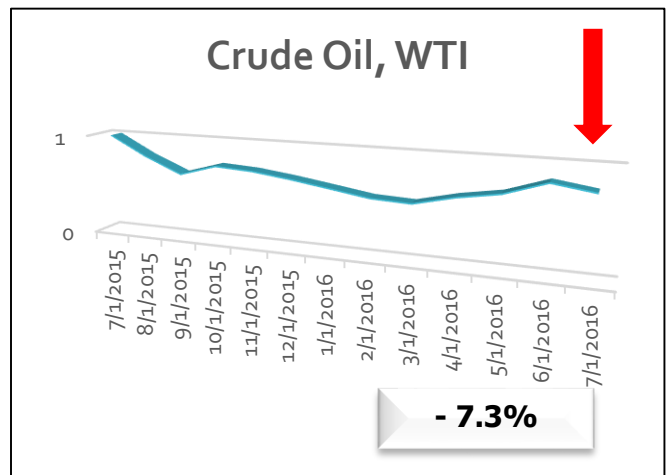
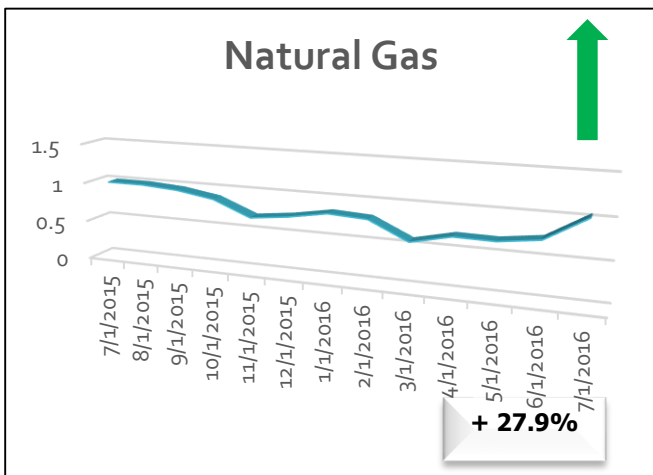
Manufacturing: The Institute of Supply Management's manufacturing PMI index unchanged at 51.3 in June, while analysts had expected an increase to 51.9. The survey has seen manufacturing struggling in the face of reduced capital spending in the energy sector, sluggish global economic growth and rising political worries.

U.S. Auto Sales: Sales through June were up 1.5 percent to 8.65 million, eclipsing last year's record of 8.5 million, according Autodata Corp. That was partly due to a strong June, which saw sales rebound after a disappointing May. Sales rose 2.5 percent to more than 1.5 million.

U.S. Home Sales: U.S. sales of new single-family homes grew at a seasonally adjusted annualized rate of 530,000 units in June, up 8.6 percent from a 488,000 annualized pace in May, the Mortgage Bankers Association said on Thursday.

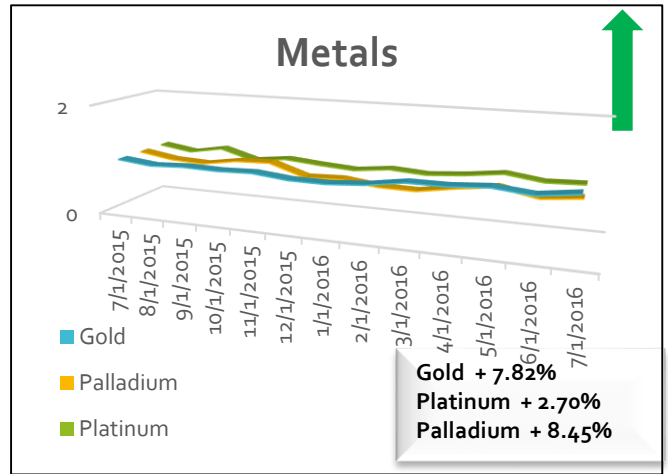
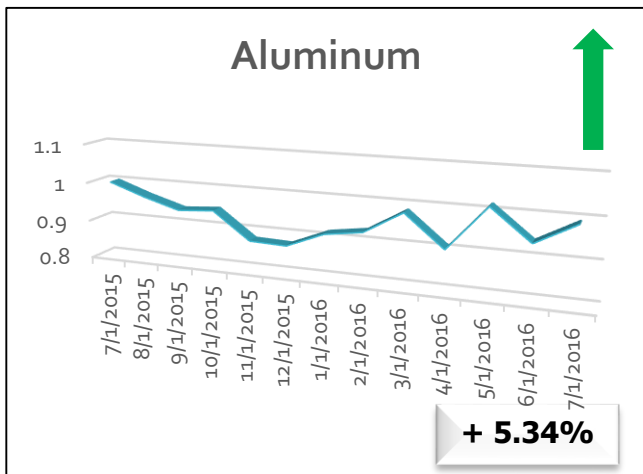
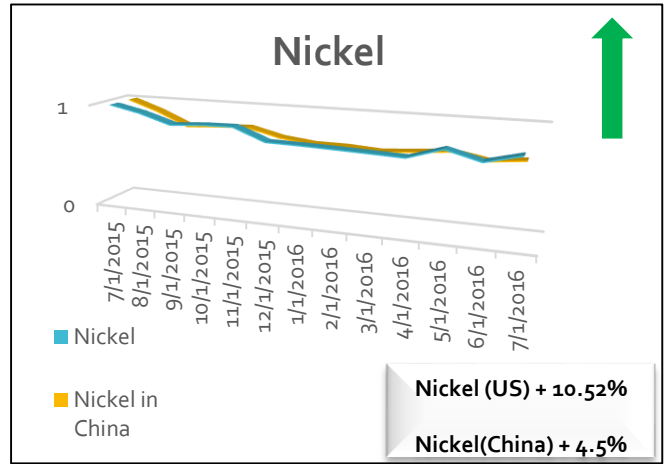
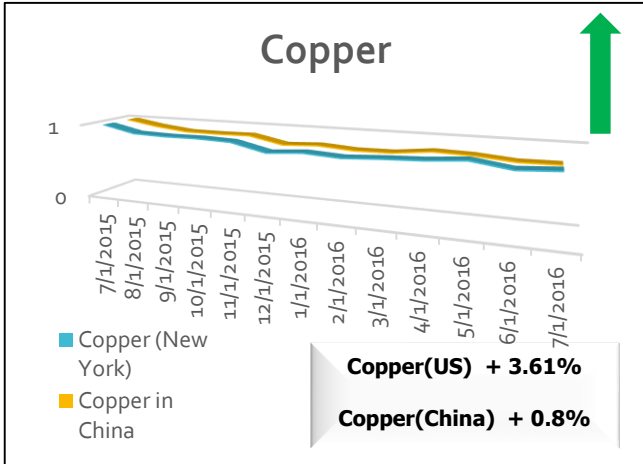
The graphs below represent a one year price trend for comparison only and do not reflect end user delivered prices. Additional 1-month trend percentages have been included on each commodity reported.

Petroleum Derivatives and Energy



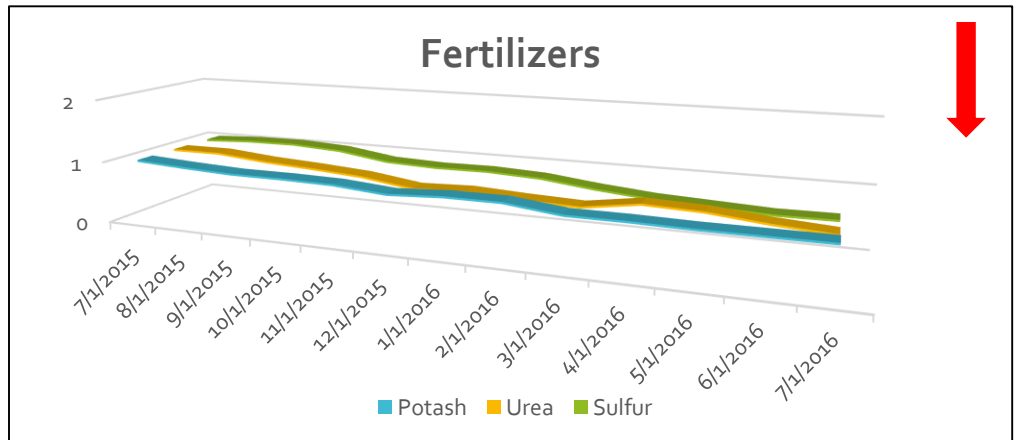
