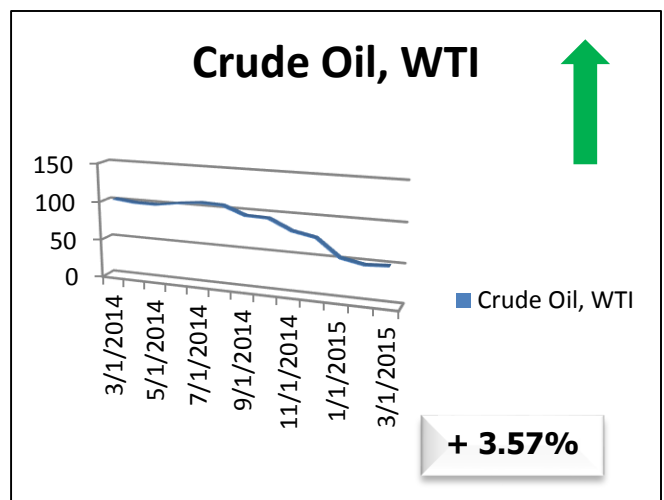
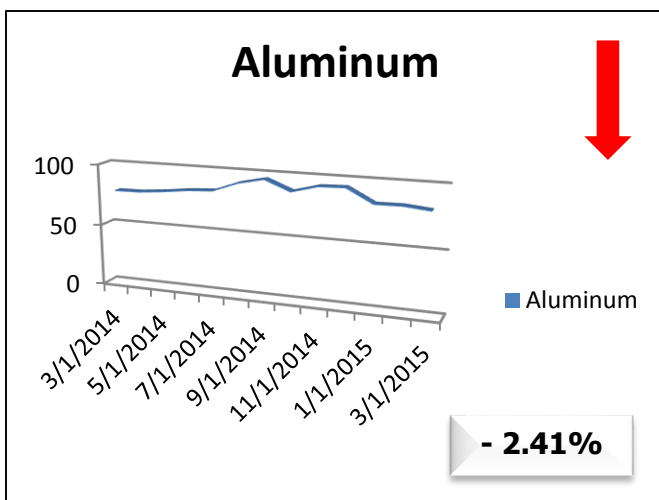


Commodity Trends:

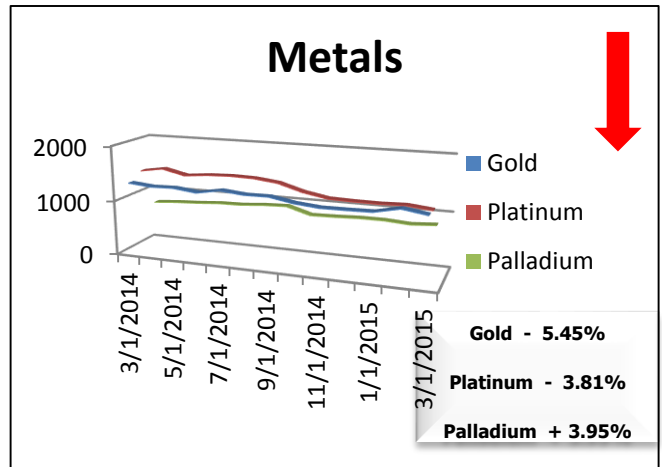
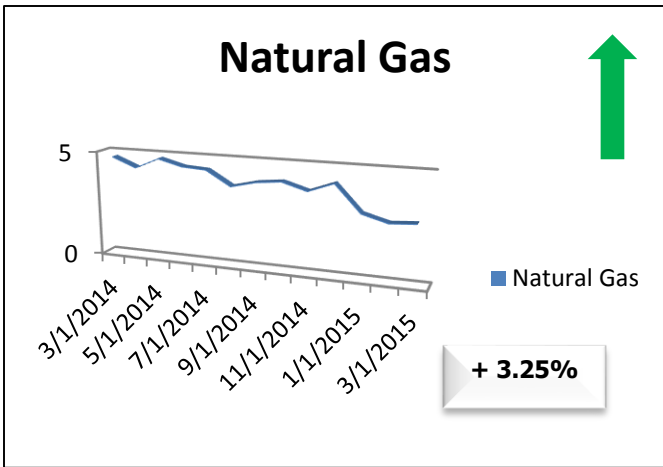
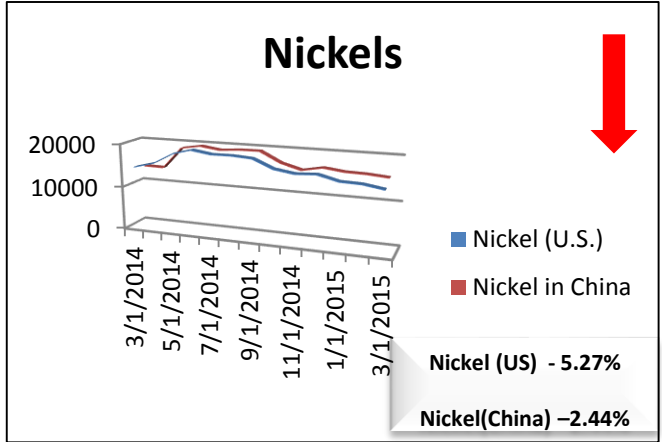
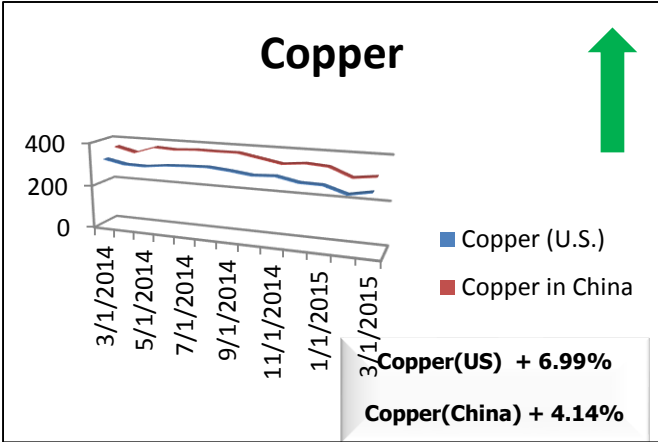
- The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that total nonfarm payroll employment increased by 297,000 jobs in February. Job gains occurred in food services, professional services, construction, and in transportation and warehousing. The unemployment rate decreased to 5.5%, down from 5.7% in January. The reading for this February is down from 6.7% in February 2014.
 - The Commerce Department announced that retail purchases fell 0.6 percent in February. Retail sales plunged for a third consecutive month as consumers remained hesitant to spend the money they've saved from low gasoline prices, and bad weather added another obstacle for shoppers.
 - The Institute for Supply Management on Friday said its Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) slipped to 52.9 in February, down from 53.5 in January. It was the fourth straight drop and the lowest reading since January 2014. Still, any reading above 50 does signal expansion.
 - Autodata Corp. reported that U.S. auto sales were up 5.3 percent to 1.25 million in February. That fell short of expected gains of 8 or 9 percent, but the mood in the industry remained positive. Analysts are expecting U.S. sales of new cars and trucks to hit their highest level in more than a decade this year
 - A monthly survey of confidence among single-family builders fell in March for the third-straight month. The National Association of Home Builders index slipped 2 points to 53. One year ago, builder sentiment was negative, at 46, but it soared to a high of 59 in September.

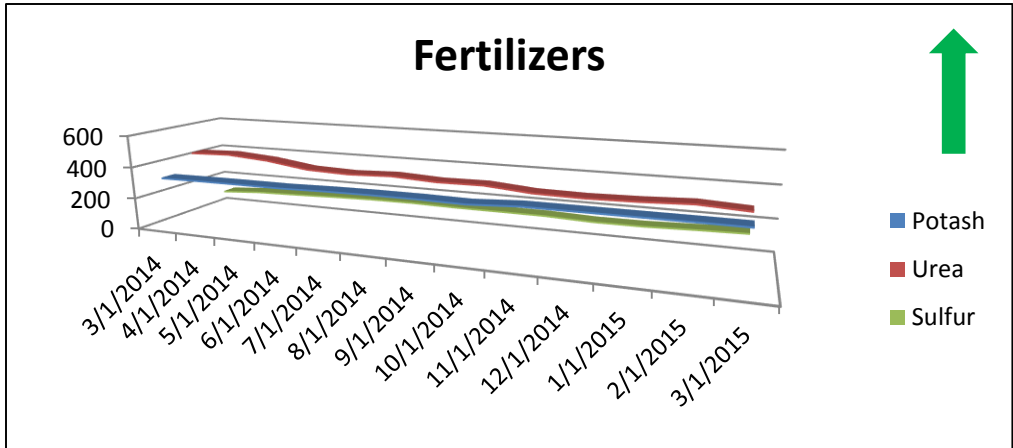
